MEDIUM TERM 1 2019 MEDIUM TERM PLAN

MATHEMATICS

The children will:

Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards beginning from any given number. Order numbers from smallest to biggest.

Distinguish between 'teen' and 'ty' numbers.

Count sets of objects accurately.

Give sensible estimations for a group of objects and count to check.

Identify ordinal positions in practical situations e.g. 1st or 2nd.

Count, read and write number up to 100. Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.

Use the language of equal to, more than, less than, most, least when counting.

Recognize numbers outside of the classroom context.

Begin to understand place value for tens and ones.

Find 1 more or 1 less than a given number up to 100.

Use visual images to understand the number system e.g. 100 square, number line.

Solve basic problems involving place value.

MATHEMATICS – BASIC SKILLS

The children will:

- -Count to and across 100 from any given number
- -Count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.

ENGLISH

Return story narrative

The children will:

Discuss reveal props and make predictions about plot of the text.

Explore and discuss illustrations throughout the text.

Question adult in role as the main character to reveal details of the plot.

Explore vocabulary in the text.

Explore the use of prefix -un in text.

Practice forming sentences orally.

Re-read model text to develop understanding of text further.

Sequence the events of the story.

Discuss if single sentence clauses make sense.

Practice correctly punctuating sentences

focusing on capital letters at the start of sentences and for names of people and places.

Practice orally retelling the story with use of

story strips or puppets.

Use adjectives to describe illustrations and feelings of main character.

SPELLING

RWI Phonics scheme

Set 1, 2 and 3 groups across Year 1.

Writing/presentation

The children will:

Use planning frame to begin to develop their own return story. Independently write their own story following their plan for guidance.

Orally rehearse sentences before writing them down to ensure they make sense.

Evaluate their writing daily with the teacher and their peers.

Re-read what they have written to ensure it makes sense.

Change some errors with support and some independently.

Answer comprehension questions to show understanding of text.

Write simple sentences from memory as dictated by the teacher.

To use plan to structure postcard.

To independently write postcard using their completed plan.

GRAMMAR AND PUNCTUATION

The children will learn how to:

Form letters correctly that all sit on the line.

Leave spaces between words.

Joining words and joining clauses with 'and'.

Beginning to punctuate sentences with a full stop, capital letter, question mark or exclamation mark.

Using a capital letters for names of people, places, the days of the week and the personal pronoun 'I'.
