Parish Safe Guarding Audit

In the autumn term the Trustees of the Archdiocese decided that every parish in the Archdiocese must undertake a Parish Safeguarding Audit. This self-assessment audit has two aims...

- 1. to measure how close each parish in the Archdiocese is to meeting the national standards currently expected of all Catholic parishes within England and Wales
- 2. to ensure all parishes create a six month plan to address any areas of concern so that they are fully compliant by summer 2020.

Unfortunately, we are already behind scheduled as the audit and improvement plan was supposed to have been completed and returned to the Archdiocese by the 30th November 2019.

As a new Parish Priest I requested a little more time to complete the audit. I was aware that it would highlight areas where we need to improve and we may well need to change some of our practices and increase the number of volunteers for some of our activities which involve children or vulnerable adults in order to comply with the new standards that are being asked of us.

On Friday I completed and returned the audit and in the coming weeks will need your help so that as a parish community we can work together to make the changes necessary in order to ensure that we are making our community as safe as possible for all who gather here.

Parish Minibus

In a similar, but unrelated news, an issue arose with the minibus last week-end when with great reluctance the decision was taken to suspend using the minibus to transport people who need to use either a zimmer frame or wheelchair to Sunday Mass while a review of the legal and health and safety implications is concluded.

A meeting of all drivers is to be arranged as soon as possible to discuss this situation, our current practice and to establish a way forward which complies with our obligations under health and safety rules and laws.
