



#### Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance is one of the most important areas of school life where parents and carers of our pupils can make the biggest impact to their learning. Here at St. Charles' we pride ourselves in having high expectations of the children and endeavour for them to thrive in our happy, vibrant and nurturing environment.

However, we have, over recent weeks, had to send letters out to some families as their child's attendance and time keeping is falling below expectations. The local authority are clamping down even more on poor attendance and punctuality, this may result in fines being issued through the courts, We are working closely with our EWO, Cath Breen, to improve attendance and punctuality at our school.

Being in school on time is equally as important, we will be closely monitoring those children who are persistently late. Every minute counts! As our doors are open at 8.40am the children start the day with a variety or learning and revision tasks including a maths focus 'Fluent in Five', handwriting and spelling practice. Even 5 minutes late when the doors have closed has an impact on your child, both academically and socially.

If your child comes to school after the gates close, parents are required to sign their child into school with the reason for the lateness. We want to work with our families; if you have any concerns you can contact our EWO by leaving a message with the school office

#### Updated Risk Assessment

We have reviewed our Risk Assessments in line with government guidance for schools. There appears to be little change for schools. Parents must still wear face coverings when dropping off and picking children up each day. Parents are also asked not to gather closely at the school gates.

I'm sure we are all enjoying some of the easing of lockdown however, as a school, we still need to be mindful of the virus. If your child does have any of the main symptoms, please book a PCR test for them. We really don't want to close bubbles because of positive cases. Remember Lateral Flow test are NOT for anyone showing symptoms, PCR TESTS MUST BE CARRIED OUT.
