EYFS is a play based curriculum

Your child will take part in a wide range of activities, both indoors and outdoors



Your child will learn through activities he or she has chosen, or from those that are led by an adult. They will be encouraged to be creative and use their imaginations.



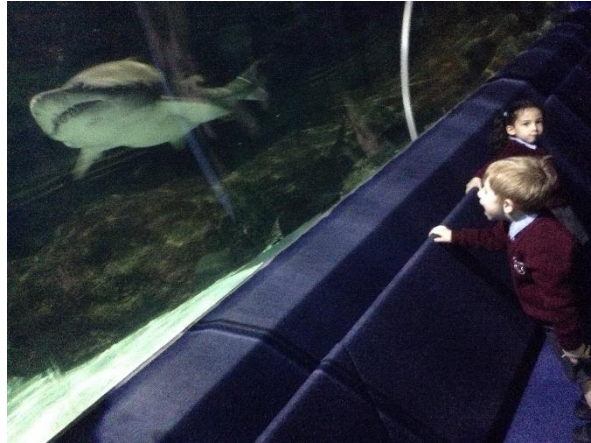
Each week children will learn about the world around them. Learning is based on children's interests and linked to a high quality text.

We go on lots of adventures!



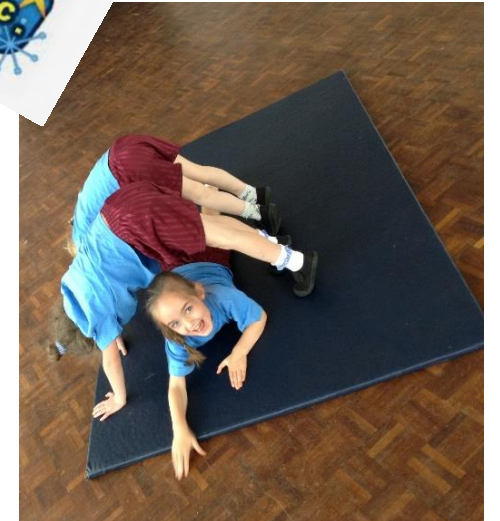
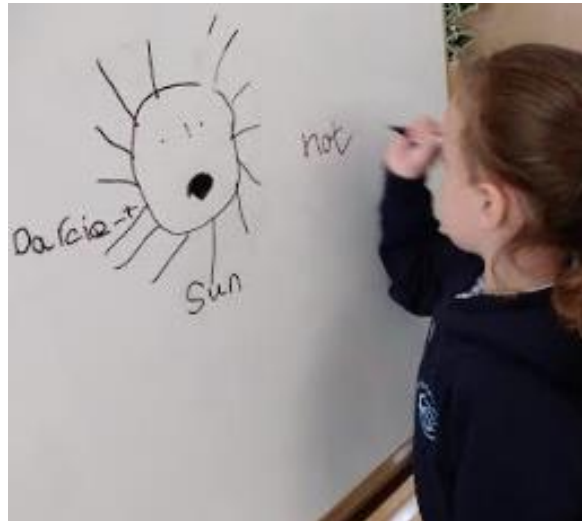
Learn about the Catholic faith and how we live our lives through gospel values – each week.

There will be bumps and falls! This will be a very important part of their learning!

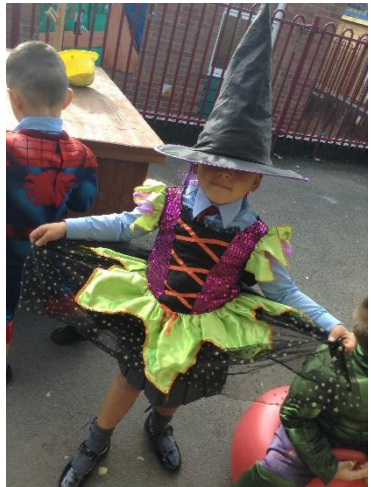

Important Information

Uniforms

It is school policy for all pupils to wear school uniform, and parents are asked to support the school in maintaining a high standard of appearance.

SUMMER UNIFORM

Boys: pale blue polo shirts with school logo, grey shorts, grey socks, black shoes (not black trainers), maroon jumper with school logo

Girls: pale blue gingham dress, white socks, white or black shoes (not trainers), maroon cardigan with school logo

WINTER UNIFORM FOR RECEPTION, Y1 AND Y2

Pale blue shirt/blouse

Grey shorts/skirt/pinafore

Maroon tie

Maroon jumper/cardigan with school logo

Grey/maroon/white socks

Black shoes (not black trainers)



Additional Items

PE Kit

Maroon shorts

Pale blue T-shirt

Black plimsolls (pumps) or trainers

All PE kit should be brought to school in a named PE bag.

You can purchase PE bags from the school office.

Book Bags

Book bags can be purchased from the school office.

They should be brought into school each day.

Water Bottle

Please ensure your child has a water bottle in school each day. These can also be purchased from the school office

Reception children have constant access to the outdoor area each day. Please ensure your child is equipped for all weathers.

Please ensure your child has everything they need each day.

Free School Meals

- If you or your partner receive any of the following benefits you can apply for free school meals.
- Universal Credit – your household earned annual income must be less than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed part of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit – with no Working Tax Credit and your annual household income is no more than £16,190 , as assessed by the Inland Revenue

If you receive or are moving to Universal Credit, your child will get free school meals until March 2022, regardless of any changes to you or your partner's income. After March 2022, existing children who no longer meet the eligibility criteria at that point will continue to receive free school meals until the end of their primary education.

Universal Free School Meals

- All Reception, Year One and Year Two children are currently entitled to a free school meal everyday.
- Some families may be entitled to free school meals for the duration of their child's time in primary school.
- Please complete the relevant forms to see if your family are entitled free school meals.

It's always worth checking to see if you are entitled to 'Free School Meals' so this can continue once your child is in year 3.

This can also provide you and your child with additional benefits.



The School Day



- The school gates are open from 8:40am
- Children will enter their classroom and the register will be taken at 8:50
- If your child is not in school by 8:50 they will need to enter via the school office and will be marked as late
- The school day ends at 3:00pm for Reception children
- Children will be collected from the fire exit in the school hall
- Please let us know in advance if an unfamiliar person is collecting your child

Punctuality and Attendance

Please ensure your child is in school on time each day.

If your child is regularly late, even by as little as 3 minutes each day, this can add up to more than a days loss of education per month. 15 minutes late every day, over a school year, is equivalent to 10 days absence.

Is there anything I need to do to
ensure my child is school ready?



Expectations for starting school in September:

- Ensure your child is able to toilet themselves independently and understands that they need to wash their hands every time they use the toilet.
- Encourage your child to be as independent as possible when getting dressed/undressed, even if it takes longer for them to get ready.
- Ensure your child is able to feed themselves by using a knife, fork and spoon correctly.
- Ensure your child is able to sit still and listen to instructions.
- Get them used to making marks with pencils, crayons, felt pens, chalks, paints, play dough, scissors- encourage the correct pencil grip.
- Give your child as many varied experiences as possible: drawing, cutting, painting, cooking, singing, making models, playing games, jigsaws, etc.
- Share stories, books and rhymes. Read to them daily and talk about the books you have read.
- Sing familiar songs and nursery rhymes.
- When playing with others encourage your child to share.
- Ensure that your child understands that they have to tidy up after themselves.
- Count everyday objects and look for numbers in the environment.
- Practise recognising their own name and attempt to write it.
