Stations of the Cross

On Thursday the Junior children visited church with Mrs Dean and Mrs Battersby to be introduced to the Stations of the Cross which is a form of prayer used traditionally in Lent.

Each of the 14 Stations retells part of Jesus' Passion (his suffering and death) through images and words. At each Station the children reflected upon Jesus' Passion and linked it to their prayers for their families and friends today.


Third Station: Jesus falls for the first time

Jesus struggled to carry the heavy cross and fell to the ground. The soldiers dragged him up and pushed him forward.

Let us reflect: Jesus was set the difficult task of carrying his cross through the busy streets. The soldiers' unkind behaviour made Jesus's task even harder. He would need help to cope.

Let us pray: Lord Jesus, sometimes people can be cruel when others are finding things difficult. Help me always to encourage those who struggle and to offer support when I can.

Let us act: Look out for classmates who are finding things difficult. Help them to find a solution, or ask a teacher for extra


