#### Why Good Attendance is IMPORTANT

**Building foundations of learning** - children build the foundational skills and knowledge that will serve as the basis of their future. Regular attendance ensures that they are consistently exposed to these foundational concepts.

**Develop key Basic Skills** such as reading, writing and maths. Missing school can hinder a child's ability to grasp these essential skills, making it harder to progress.

**Social Development** - attending regularly allows children to interact with their peers, learn social skills and develop friendships.

Consistent Routine - regular attendance establishes a consistent daily routine. Predictable routines can help children feel secure and comfortable which positively impacts their emotional well-being and ability to learn.

Early Intervention - schools often identify difficulties in learning early on. Good attendance allows teachers and staff to provide interventions to support learning earlier.

Habit forming - attending school regularly helps children to develop a habit of responsibility and punctuality, which are valuable life skills which will benefit them in the future.

Preparation for Secondary Education - good attendance in primary school sets the stage for success in secondary education. It ensures the children have a strong academic foundation for their next stage in education.

## Pupil Premium Funding

If your circumstances have changed recently you could be eligible. Please look at the link below to see if you are entitled to Free School Meals.

Statistics indicate that more children in our school are entitled to pupil premium, free milk and meals.

- Income Support Income-based Jobseekers
  Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit runon, Universal Credit.

# Nursery Places

Did you know your child can begin attending our Nursery as soon as they turn 3?

Let me explain... All children receive funding for 15 hrs per week the term following their 3rd



birthday, but are eligible to come to Nursery the day after their 3rd birthday, through a self funded pathway. This means you can pay our nursery fees to bridge the gap between their 3rd birthday and the following term when their funding begins.

Brilliant news!

There is also a 30 hr extended childcare offer available for working parents; it is worth looking into this to see if you're eligible. Some criteria includes working 16+ hours per week inc. maternity/paternity leave and sick leave.
